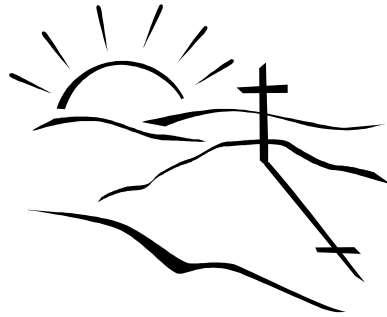

Kelly & Connie Dehnert

Kelly & Connie are in Malawi, Africa at the African Bible College. They both teach and serve in many other ways as well. Kelly recently was in the United States with some of his students on a musical tour:

Dear Friends,

Wow... that was a full, interesting and wonderful 3 weeks! It was the performances that really made the trip an incredible joy. Every audience was very, very receptive to the music (including traditional Malawian, jazz, funk, Reggae, Black Gospel, and mixtures). The students really enjoyed the excitement created by their singing, playing and dancing. It was good to bring Africa to the US showing off the talents and gifts of God's image-bearers rather than the usual war, poverty and disease. God is doing great things in Africa and these students made that quite evident to their hosts...

Travel went extremely smoothly. I am so thankful that God kept things in excellent order...

New experiences for the students: tall buildings, good roads (with no people or animals walking on them), escalators, airplanes, automated bathrooms, billions of food choices, free refills, hotel rooms as big as some homes...

So, on return, we now need to work through some of the angst it created to go into another country that is not your own. One comment upon return was that they didn't know their country was so "backward". The first reaction is to simply hate your own country and see only the good in the newly experienced country. It is hard to process through the failings and strengths of both countries... It once again brings me around to the recognition that we cross cultures to bring the gospel to bear on both our own culture and our neighbor's and it challenges us both. It also helps to remember this world is NOT our home.

The homecoming was one of the greatest joys in my life. I so adore my wife and children, though I did have to leave one in the US (I really loved seeing Britney for 3 days at Covenant College). Connie and I decided we would never do a trip of this length apart from one another again. It was hard and yucky!

Thank you for all of your prayers and support. You were vital prayer partners from the beginning through to the end, and I so appreciate and depend upon your part in the ministry here.
